State Rep. Ronald G. Waters, D-Phila./Delaware, sponsored an educational youth bus trip to Baltimore on Tuesday for students who attend schools within the 191st legislative district The trip was designed to inform the students about African American history and its future.

"It is essential to the future to get the youth involved in African-American history so they understand where they came from and where they would like to go," Waters said. The students visited the National Great Blacks in Wax Museum to stimulate an interest in African-American History by revealing little-known and often neglected facts in history.
